Llandaff Cathedral Community Council member

Who is eligible: members are voted onto the Council from any of the congregations of the Cathedral and we encourage all congregations to be represented there. Nominees must be on the electoral roll of the Cathedral, which includes being a regular communicant worshipper for at least 6 months. Nominations are received at the annual Vestry meeting in the Spring. An election is held if there are more nominations than places. The Cathedral Clergy are ex officio members of the LCCC. A Lay Chair is elected annually.

What skills are needed: an interest in all of Cathedral life and a commitment to the flourishing of the community. A willingness to give time in meetings and in follow up activities or events. Good listening and communication skills to be aware of the groundswell of opinion among congregations, and to take part in discussions in a balanced way. Creativity with ideas is also welcomed.

Training: No formal training is needed but members must read the papers sent round before each meeting and respect the usual ground rules for formal meetings with agenda and minutes.

Role: representing the congregations in discussions over Cathedral matters; hearing updates from the clergy and staff re events; supporting the development of the community and its volunteers; being an accurate conduit of information between the LCCC and the congregations; being an advocate for the Cathedral.

Time Commitment: the LCCC meets 6 times in the year in the evening for about 2 hours. Further time may be involved in assisting with events and in informal ways as in the role description above.
