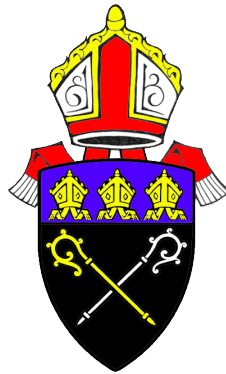

THE INTRODUCTION

Please turn to face the West Door. The Dean introduces the service from the West Steps of the Cathedral:

The Dean My brothers and sisters in Christ, today we gather in the presence of Almighty God to welcome and inaugurate the ministry of Mary, the 73rd Bishop of Llandaff and to place her in the Episcopal Seat of her Cathedral Church. As the successor to Dyfrig and Teilo, Mary is now called to be our Bishop in this place at this time, the chief shepherd of Christ's flock in this Diocese and guardian of the faith of the Apostles. In which faith, we are called through the ages to follow Christ in joyful service. As she begins her ministry among us, let us pray that we may all be faithful to our vocation and strengthened in our calling as the People of God.

THE BISHOP ENTERS THE CATHEDRAL

Bishop Mary arrives at the West Door and knocks three times with her staff.

The Dean Let the doors be opened, that we may welcome our Bishop.

The doors are opened by the Wardens of the Parish.

The Dean Bishop Mary, we welcome you to your Diocese and Cathedral Church in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All **We welcome you in the name of the Lord.**

A young person Bishop Mary, we have looked forward to your arrival – come among us as one who serves.

The Archdeacons

Bishop Mary, your pilgrim journey in faith has brought you here. God has shown what he requires of you; to do justly, to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

The Bishop Friends, I am a servant of Jesus Christ and I come seeking the grace of God to proclaim the love of Christ and with you to worship God with heart and soul, mind and strength.

During the singing of Jubilate Deo, the Diocesan Chancellor and Registrar make their way to the Pulpitum and the Bishop is led through the Nave.

THE READING OF THE MANDATE

Please sit.

The Bishop receives the Archbishop's mandate from the Registrar and presents it to the Dean, saying:

Mr Dean, I present to you the mandate of Andrew, our Archbishop, for my induction and installation.

The Dean hands the mandate to the Diocesan Chancellor who reads it and then addresses the Bishop, saying:

Bishop Mary, according to custom, I invite you to take the appointed oath.

The Diocesan Registrar invites the Bishop to place her hand on the Cathedral Bible, used at the re-hallowing of the Nave in 1960.

The Bishop In the name of God, Amen. I, Mary, by divine permission Bishop of Llandaff, hereby promise to respect, maintain and defend the rights, privileges and liberties of the Church in this diocese; and of this Cathedral Church; and will seek to serve it with truth, justice, mercy and love, showing myself in all things an example to the flock. So help me God, Amen.

The Bishop kisses the Bible.

The Dean Bishop Mary, may God give you grace to fulfill this promise.

The Bishop stands as she is presented with the mitre by the Archdeacons.

The Dean hands the Diocesan Crosier to the Bishop, saying:

Bishop Mary, receive this Diocesan Crosier as a sign of your authority and care in the Diocese of Llandaff. Keep watch over the whole flock in which the Holy Spirit has appointed you Shepherd.

All **Encourage the faithful, restore the lost, build up the Body of Christ.**

THE INSTALLATION OF THE BISHOP

The Dean takes the Bishop by the right hand and places her in the Episcopal Seat.

The Dean By virtue of the mandate of Andrew, Archbishop of Wales, I, Richard Peers, Dean of Llandaff, do hereby induct and install you, Mary, by divine permission Bishop of Llandaff, into the real possession of the Bishopric and Episcopal See of Llandaff, with all and rights and dignities and all its opportunities for service; and I place you in the Episcopal Seat of this Cathedral Church in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in, from this time forth and for evermore.
Amen.

All May God sustain you and establish you in righteousness and holiness and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always.
Amen.

The Bishop moves to stand on the Presbytery step.

THE PRESENTATION

The Dean My brothers and sisters in Christ, I present to you Mary, Bishop of Llandaff.

All **We welcome you in the name of Christ: thanks be to God.**

The Bishop is greeted with applause.

THE FIRST READING

Reader A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

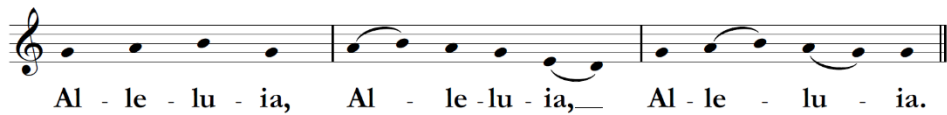



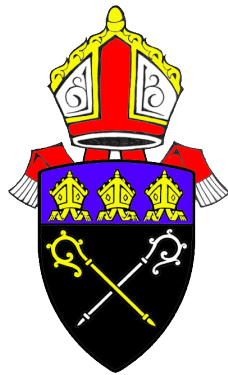
