

## WE PROCLAIM THE WORD OF GOD

*Reader* A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The next day the Jewish rulers, the Jewish elders, and the teachers of the law met in Jerusalem. Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander were there. Everyone from the high priest's family was there. They made Peter and John stand before them. The Jewish leaders asked them: "By what power or authority did you do this?"

Then Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit. He said to them, "Rulers of the people and you elders, are you questioning us about a good thing that was done to a crippled man? Are you asking us who made him well? We want all of you and all the Jewish people to know that this man was made well by the power of Jesus Christ from Nazareth! You nailed him to a cross, but God raised him from death. This man was crippled, but he is now well and able to stand here before you because of the power of Jesus! Jesus is

'the stone that you builders did not want.

It has become the cornerstone.'

Jesus is the only One who can save people. No one else in the world is able to save us."


