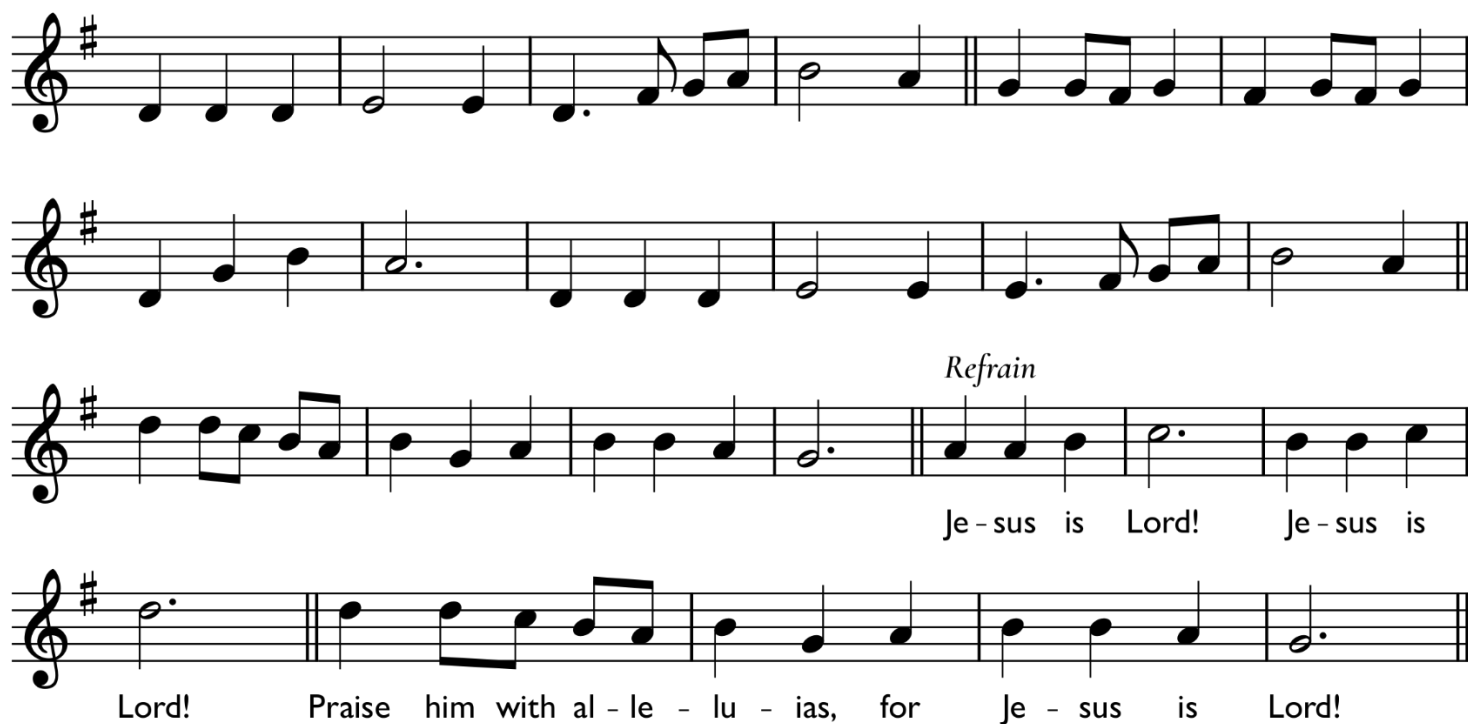
1. Praise to God whose word was spoken
