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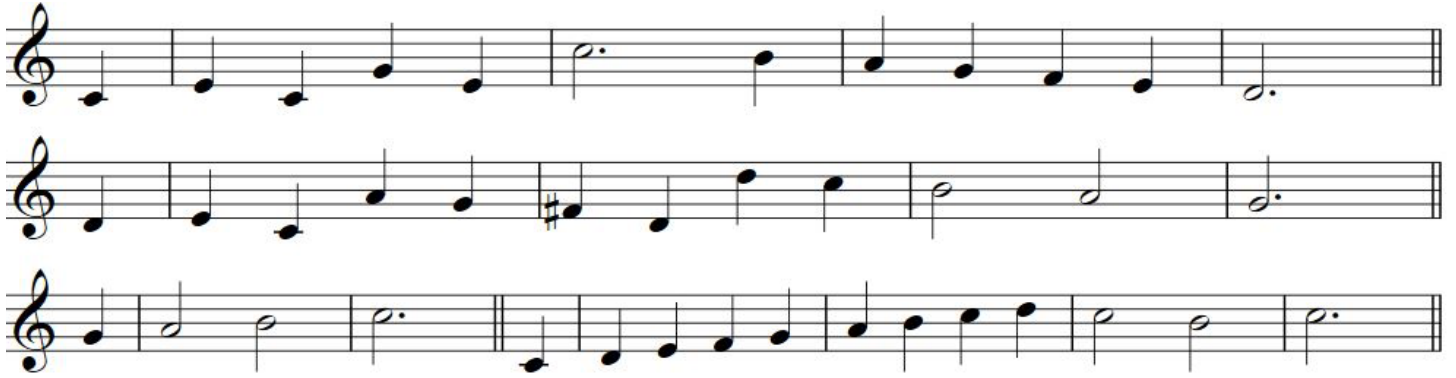
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The Opening Hymn

Eat we Manna from above.

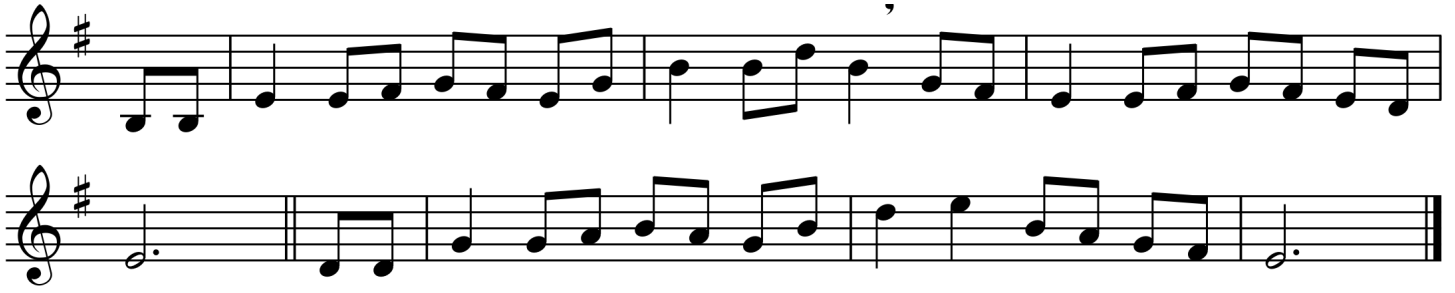
3. Mighty victim from on high,
