Cardiff Food Bank – We are writing to say a big Thank You to all those who collect food on our behalf. Without your efforts we would not be able to feed those in crisis in our city. In 2017 we provided three-day parcels of food for 11,556 people and demand continues to rise.

From July to September of this year Llandaff Cathedral donated **196.8kg** of food, equivalent to 3-day food parcels for **16** people. Thank you to all of those who have contributed food and arranged the collections and deliveries. *The Cardiff Food Bank Team*

Cathedral Shop – The following books from Church House Publications (Church of England) are now on sale in the Cathedral Shop:

Reflections for Advent (£2.99) covers November 26th to December 24th, with commentary on the Bible passage and Collect for the day, and includes some seasonal prayers and an Order for Night Prayer (Compline).
