

## THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

## ***Cathedral News***

**Advent Service 2021:** Entry to the Advent Service on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> November at 4.00pm is by **pre-booked ticket only**. Please note that 300 congregational tickets are available for the service, as for all other Christmas services and events. This reduced capacity is for reasons of public health and will allow some space between groups without requiring 2 metres social distancing.

Seats will not be numbered and tickets must be booked for all those over 3 years of age. Should you book and later find that you will be unable to attend, *please cancel your booking*; this will enable others who have not been able to get tickets, to fill these places. Doors will open at 3.15pm; please arrive in time to be seated by 3.45pm, 15 minutes before the service is due to begin. The service will also be live streamed.

**Bible Study:** During Advent the Bible Study Group will be following an **Advent course of reading** together. Others are welcome to join us for those four weeks if interested. The book we will be using is by Bishop Gregory Cameron, Bishop of St Asaph, titled **'An Advent Book of Days; meeting the characters of Christmas'** and is available online for £8-£9. The group meets on Mondays at 4pm-5pm in Prebendal House and the Advent course will start on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> November.

**Altar Servers:** under Covid regulations, only the clergy handle the communion vessels. However, it is now possible to have a crucifer and two acolytes to lead the procession. We have a children's team of altar servers for the 9am All Age Eucharist with children taking turns each week. We now hope to restore a small team for the 11.15am service as well. Some of those involved before lockdown are still available, but not enough to form a rota as yet. Adults and teenagers who would be interested to take part in this are warmly invited to contact the clergy.

**Cathedral Shop:** The shop has Christmas cards and a selection of Christmas gifts as well as Advent candles. Anne and David Enoch have kindly donated some copies of David's newly published autobiography to be sold in the shop, with proceeds to the Cathedral. The title is: **Enoch's Walk: 95 Not Out: Journey of a Psychiatrist**. *"What emerges in David Enoch's remarkable autobiography is a holistic and compelling vision for medicine and psychiatry, and indeed for the whole of human life. And at its heart is a faith that Enoch believes". Dr Iwan Russell-Jones, Professor of Theology & the Arts, Regent College, University of British Columbia, Vancouver.*

**Llandaff Cathedral Choristers' Association:** In addition to the Cathedral Christmas Cards available from the Cathedral Shop you can also buy Christmas cards in aid of the Chorister Association. **Supporting refugees:** The Diocese has launched a toolkit to guide individuals and churches on how best to support the people of Afghanistan and those arriving in Wales in the coming days. It also includes some context on the schemes to welcome Afghan refugees here in Wales (which are being run and coordinated by the UK Government) and a few words on advocacy around the Borders and Nationality Bill which is currently passing through Westminster (and will be a UK-wide policy).
