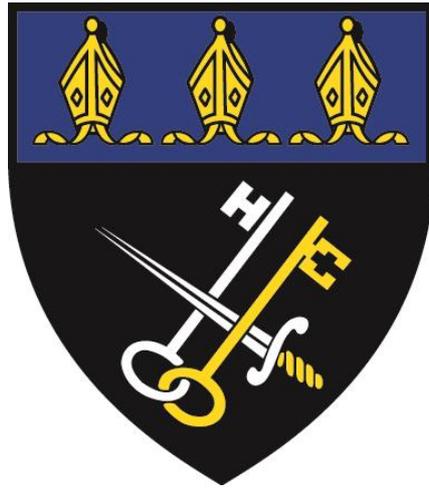

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

THE EPISTLE

A reading from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians.

Concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

THE GOSPEL

Hear the Holy Gospel according to Saint John
Glory be to thee, O Lord.

There was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

We beseech thee, O Lord, to direct with thy heavenly wisdom those who rule over the nations of the world, that thy people may be faithfully and justly governed; bless thy servant *Elizabeth our Queen* and all who exercise authority under her. Lord, in thy mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

Of thy goodness, O Lord, help and comfort all those who are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity, granting them a happy issue out of all their afflictions. Lord, in thy mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

We commend to thy gracious keeping, O Lord, all thy servants departed this life in thy faith and fear, beseeching thee to grant us with them everlasting light and peace.

All glory, praise and thanksgiving be unto thee Almighty God our heavenly Father, creator and sustainer of all things, maker of man in thine own image, who gavest thine only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him and to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption. There he made the one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his Holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memorial of that his precious death until his coming again.

Therefore we beseech thee, O merciful Father, to sanctify with thy Holy Spirit these thy gifts of Bread and Wine, that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, may be partakers of his most precious Body and Blood:

Who in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,

Take, eat, this is my Body which is given for you:
Do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the Cup and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying,

Drink ye all of this,
for this is my Blood of the New Covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins:
Do this. as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, making the memorial of the blessed Passion, mighty Resurrection, and glorious Ascension, of thy dearly beloved Son as he hath commanded us, rejoicing in his gift of the Holy Spirit, and looking for his coming again with power and great glory, we thy servants, with all thy holy people, do set forth before thy Divine Majesty this Bread of eternal life and this Cup of everlasting salvation.

And we beseech thee to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and to grant to us and thy whole Church remission of our sins and all other benefits of his Passion. And we pray that all we, who are partakers of this holy Communion, may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction and be numbered in the glorious company of thy saints.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, in whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, throughout all ages, world without end. **Amen.**

Cathedral News

After service refreshments: the most recent changes to COVID guidelines mean that we have had to suspend the serving of after-service refreshments after the 9.00 am service. This is a temporary change while the restrictions remain as they are.

Chorister Chaperone Vacancy: The Dean and Chapter seek to appoint a committed individual to join the team of chaperones who supervise the cathedral choristers, covering duties on up to three afternoons (4.00-6.15pm on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday) each week. The Exact duties may be tailored to the candidate, but this role will include working with Cathedral staff, the Cathedral School and other stakeholders in ensuring the safety, wellbeing and flourishing of the choristers.

The music which the Cathedral Choir provide is an integral part of worship and mission and the music department is committed to promoting Llandaff Cathedral as a centre for excellence in music and liturgy. The life of a Cathedral Chorister is a rewarding but incredibly demanding one for boys, girls and their families. We are seeking a chaperone who understands these demands and will be a practical and pastoral support to the choristers.

The closing date for applications is Noon on **Monday 24th January** and the successful candidate would, subject to a satisfactory enhanced Disclosure and Barring Check, start as soon as possible after this. Further information about the role may be downloaded [here](#).

PLANT A TREE FOR THE JUBILEE

In 2022, the Patron of the Friends of Llandaff Cathedral, Her Majesty the Queen, will celebrate 70 years as monarch and the Friends aim to mark this with the planting of 70 trees. Some of these will, we hope, be in the cathedral precincts, enhancing air quality and the environment. We are asking members of the Friends to make the number of trees up to 70 by planting one or more trees somewhere themselves, perhaps in the garden, at work or somewhere in remembrance. Planting can begin anytime now. A tree might be just the Christmas gift you have been looking for. The tree can be any size, and one of our North Wales members plans a rose tree in a tub, as her garden is small. Will you help, please? Supporting refugees: The Diocese has launched a toolkit to guide individuals and churches on how best to support the people of Afghanistan and those arriving in Wales in the coming days. It also includes some context on the schemes to welcome Afghan refugees here in Wales (which are being run and coordinated by the UK Government) and a few words on advocacy around the Borders and Nationality Bill which is currently passing through Westminster (and will be a UK-wide policy). Here are some of the key things to note:

- Social distancing guidelines must be maintained at all times – especially before and after the services. Please respect the notices indicating that certain rows of chairs are not in use.
- The '2-metre distance' rule means that the capacity of the Cathedral will be between 70 and 80 individuals although family groups sitting together will legitimately increase the number.
- 5 cathedral chairs must be left clear *between* households.
- We continue to display the QR code that links with the **NHS Tracing App**.
- Hand sanitiser must be used on entry.
- Face-coverings remain compulsory in public buildings. This includes the Cathedral.
- Everyone attending will be invited to complete a 'track and trace' card.
- Communion will be administered standing and in one kind only.
- Ritual and ceremony will continue to be kept to a minimum.

- No service sheets will be used – the order of service will be available online to print in advance and bring with you or to follow on a phone or other mobile device. They are also available through QR codes displayed at each service.
