WE PROCLAIM THE WORD OF GOD

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews

God's word is alive and working. It is sharper than a sword sharpened on both sides. It cuts all the way into us, where the soul and the spirit are joined. It cuts to the centre of our joints and our bones. And God's word judges the thoughts and feelings in our hearts. Nothing in all the world can be hidden from God. Everything is clear and lies open before him. And to him we must explain the way we have lived.

We have a great high priest who has gone into heaven. He is Jesus the Son of God. So let us hold on to the faith we have. For our high priest is able to understand our weaknesses. He was tempted in every way that we are, but he did not sin. Let us, then, feel free to come before God's throne. Here there is grace. And we can receive mercy and grace to help us when we need it.

Genesis 2. 18-22

Hear the Gospel of Christ according to Saint Mark
Glory to you, O Lord.

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, 'Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: "You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother."' He said to Jesus, 'Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.' Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, 'How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!' And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, 'Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.' They were greatly astounded and said to one another, 'Then who can be saved?' Jesus looked at them and said, 'For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.'

Peter began to say to him, 'Look, we have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good

news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age – houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields – but with persecutions – and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.’

we offer you these and all the gifts you freely give to us.
Send your Holy Spirit to be with us
and all who share this bread and drink from this cup.
Help us to trust you,
bring us closer together and welcome us,
with all your people,
into Jesus’ glorious kingdom.

All honour and glory belong to you, Father,
through Jesus, your Son,
with the Holy Spirit:
one God, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

Cathedral News

Parish Choir: The Parish Choir of Llandaff Cathedral is opening its doors to new members! Girls and Boys aged between 7 and 11 who love singing are invited to come and find out more about what it is to be a chorister. Current members of the choir come from a variety of schools all over Cardiff and equal opportunity to join is given to both boys and girls.

As part of the choir, choristers rehearse on Monday evenings and sing at services on Sundays in term time as well as at Christmas, Easter and other special occasions. Until very recently there has been an enforced period of shutdown for the choir due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As choirs all over the world begin to meet again, a new programme of singing is envisaged for the Parish Choir and a long-term plan will be formed during the term up until Christmas.

During a chorister's time in the choir, he or she will be trained to a professional standard, learning valuable skills that will set them up for the rest of their life in whatever field they choose, including a sense of shared purpose with peers and seniors, self-discipline, and an ability to organise their time.

We are inviting any boy or girl who would like to find out more to come to an open rehearsal in the cathedral on **Monday 11th October** from 6.30-7.30pm. There is no obligation to join on a permanent basis, but just to come and find out all about what we do at the Cathedral and to have some fun singing!

Supporting refugees: The Diocese has launched a toolkit to guide individuals and churches on how best to support the people of Afghanistan and those arriving in Wales in the coming days. It also includes some context on the schemes to welcome Afghan refugees here in Wales (which are being run and coordinated by the UK Government) and a few words on advocacy around the Borders and Nationality Bill which is currently passing through Westminster (and will be a UK-wide policy). Here are some of the key things to note:

- We continue to display the QR code that links with the **NHS Tracing App**.
- Hand sanitiser must be used on entry.
