

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from the first book of Kings.

The LORD said to Elijah, 'Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel; and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abelmeholah as prophet in your place.' So he set out from there, and found Elisha son of Shaphat, who was ploughing. There were twelve yoke of oxen ahead of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and threw his mantle over him. He left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, 'Let me kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow you.' Then Elijah said to him, 'Go back again; for what have I done to you?' He returned from following him, took the yoke of oxen, and slaughtered them; using the equipment from the oxen, he boiled their flesh, and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out and followed Elijah, and became his servant.

THE SECOND LESSON

A reading from the letter of Saint Paul to the Galatians.

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not


gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

Galatians 5.1,13-25

THE GOSPEL

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to Saint Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for him; but they did not receive him, because his face was set towards Jerusalem. When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, 'Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?' But he turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village.

As they were going along the road, someone said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' And Jesus said to him, 'Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.' To another Jesus said, 'Follow me.' But he said, 'Lord, first let me go and bury my father.' But Jesus said to him, 'Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.' Another

said, 'I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home.' Jesus said to him, 'No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

The Appointment of the next Dean of Llandaff

We thank Dean Gerwyn for his service to the Cathedral.

In preparation for the appointment of the next Dean of Llandaff, the Bishop has asked the Chapter to prepare role and person specifications for the post. An Advisory Group has been formed, which includes members of the Chapter, a representative of the Greater Chapter and also of the Cathedral's congregations.

The appointment process is expected to run as follows:

- A Profile will be completed and an advert to appear in the *Church Times* on Friday 8th July. The advert will run for four consecutive weeks.
- Shortlisting will take place by the Interview Panel in early August. (The Panel is appointed by the Bishop, and includes her, along with members of Chapter, Greater Chapter and Cathedral Congregations different representatives from those who are part of the above mentioned Advisory Group.)
- Interviews will be held in early September.

The appointment of a Dean in the Church in Wales has always been in the gift of the Diocesan Bishop, and this occasion is no exception. The role of the Interview Panel is to make a recommendation to the Bishop, as part of an open and competitive process. On this occasion there will be a wide consultation about the appointment and the Chapter is inviting all members of the Cathedral community to participate in this process. If you are on the Cathedral's email system, you should receive a direct message with a link to an online questionnaire. If you aren't on the email list, or would prefer to submit your response by paper, there are forms available at the back of the nave today. A clearly marked box for paper returns will be placed near the shop. (We would point out that electronic

submissions are much preferred, as they will greatly speed up the process of analysis of responses.) Whether electronically or on paper, **all submissions will need to be returned by 9am on Monday 27th June.**
